	In the 2025-2027 programme we are, unfortunately, unable to offer Erasmus Mundus Journalism scholarships for our students. However, we are pleased to award two Mundus Journalism Consortium scholarships of €10,000 each to the two strongest applicants. All applicants (who do not already hold a 2-year Master's degree) will be considered for these scholarships, hence, you do not have to indicate within the application package that you want to apply for a scholarship. If awarded a Mundus Journalism Consortium Scholarship, you will still be responsible for covering the tuition fees yourself.  The cost of living is rather high in both Denmark and the country of your specialisation year. Additionally, our full-time studies workload allows minimal time for employment next to your studies — especially in year 2. Therefore, it is crucial for us to ensure that applicants:  a) are aware in advance about these expenses b) have carefully considered how they will finance their studies.
